Voting Policies and Procedures

- Every organization has one vote with a **simple majority** needed for a vote to pass.
- Items to be voted on should be sent to the Chair **two weeks** prior to a meeting. Chair will forward this information and any accompanying materials to the entire Juneau Homeless Coalition.
- **Quorum:** For a Resolution to be passed the following agency members must vote. *These include:*

Front Street Clinic
Gastineau Human Services
Housing First
JAMHI
Juneau Youth Services
Polaris House
St. Vincent DePaul
The Glory Hole.*

- Every organization can vote in person at the Coalition meeting by representative or by proxy. If unable to attend a meeting, organization representatives can email the Chair with their final vote.

Financial Arrangements for the Juneau Homeless Coalition

The Ad Hoc Personnel Committee recommends that the Juneau Homeless Coalition obtain an IRS Tax ID number and become its own organization.

Juneau Youth Services has agreed to oversee this account on the Juneau Homeless Coalition's behalf.

What does this mean for the Juneau Homeless Coalition?

- Membership dues, donations, or any revenue accepted by the Juneau Homeless Coalition is subject to CBJ sales tax.
- The JHC **will not** have 501© 3 status and is ineligible to apply for grant funding directly.
- Brad Parfitt is the current signee on the Juneau Homeless Coalition bank account at Wells Fargo. A JHC co-signer should be chosen and this transition can take place immediately.

SUBCOMMITTEE GOALS
