Initiative 1: Develop Juneau as a Regional Rebuild Service Center Through Favorable Sales Tax Treatment Champion: Chris Gerondale • Progress: • The team held two meetings to work on this initiative over the last couple weeks



- o Chris Gerondale is working on figuring out the total value of rebuilds
 - He spoke with several firms including the Vancouver BC Chamber of Commerce and a helicopter trades association
 - He spoke with John Pugh at UAS to see if UAS could assist the team in analyzing the impact of sales tax/rebuilds on the revenue of CBJ
- o There is not much of an appetite for favorable sales tax treatment on the purchasing of parts

Work plan:

- The helicopter trades association will give the team information within a couple
- o Chris will follow up with UAS in a couple of weeks
- The team needs to identify a lawyer to work with to draft language to submit to CBJ but this is a task for further down the road

- The team met once and discussed how best to distribute information about the services of mining support firms
- o Jason Ginter spoke with Amanda Shaw with AMA to see if this information could be made available on AMA's website

- o Chris Gerondale believes the directory is different from the journal and might be the better target
 - Chris to bring this idea to the AMA planning committee, which is currently discussing this idea

Initiative 4: Develop Industrial Land Within CBJ

Progress:

Two productive meetings have been held recently

- The group decided that the best way to determine the demand for industrial land is to survey firms attending the Innovation Summit
- Dylan reached out to CBJ to see if they could help create an inventory of industrial land that meets certain criteria

Work plan:

Initiative 5: Career Building in Environmental Science and Engineering

Progress:

- There is a new license for environmental engineers in AK (civil engineers used to do this work)
- o UA is considering creating an environmental engineering degree program
- UAS now offers a 2 + 2 program that feeds into the engineering programs at UAA/UAF; this is a big success
- Oil companies have requested that UAA/UAF start an environmental engineering degree program

Work plan:

- Lori Sowa to attend meeting of oil companies and UA and to ask them about their needs in terms of skills of new hires
- Chris Gianotti to draft a survey to gather information about needs of mines and services
- o Amy Dieffenbacher to develop list of mines and service providers to distribute
