

#### An Economic Cluster is a Set of Firms

- ☐ In the same or related field
- Located in the same geographic area
- Linked by service or supplier relationships, common customers and/or supporting institutions
- Reliant on a shared regional labor market
- Complement but also compete with one another
- Draw productive advantage from their mutual proximity
