JEDC Summer 2021STEM Camp COVID-19 Mitigation Plan

Juneau Economic Development Council will implement a series of strategies to help slow the spread of COVID-19 and prevent outbreaks at our camp, including but not limited to:

- Health & Exposure Screening for symptoms of COVID-19
 - Health Screening and Policy
 - <u>Staff</u> and <u>families</u> of campers are highly encouraged to do a health screening before coming to camp premises every morning.
 - Health screening information will be stored only for essential staff in case of need for contact tracing.
 - Campers or staff who exhibit symptoms during our health check or during the day will be asked to go home, with information shared only to essential personnel in accordance with the ADA.
 - Focused cleaning precautions will be followed if staff or campers are sent home.
 - Families will be notified immediately, should this occur
 - Campers and staff will be asked to obtain a negative COVID-19 test upon reasonable suspicion of having contracted the virus
 - Exposure Screening and Policy
 - We require that staff and campers stay home when they are sick, have been exposed, or are caring for someone who is sick.
 - Travel guidelines
 - Staff must have proof of a recent negative COVID-19 test result if unvaccinated and have traveled in the 14 days preceding camp
 - Campers and household members of campers who are unvaccinated are required to have a negative COVID-19 test result before attending camp
 - Managing suspect or confirmed case(s), including contact tracing efforts
 - Strongly encouraging vaccination for all eligible people
- Camp Strategies
 - Capping camps at 15 students
 - Reviewing safety protocols for staff and campers
 - Requiring masks for campers and staff, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated

- Using CDC recommended physical distancing of 3 feet between students during calm activities, 6 feet during vigorous activities or eating.
- Improved ventilation
- Modifying camp activities to promote outdoor and other lower-risk activities
- Cleaning facilities and equipment daily and limiting the use of communal items
- Promoting frequent hand washing and/or hand sanitizing
- Proper use of personal protective equipment by any healthcare staff
- Outbreak Contingency Plan
 - Should CBJ Risk reach the Moderate Level:
 - Camps will remain operational until further notice
 - The physical distancing between campers will increase to 6 feet
 - We will double down on handwashing/hand sanitizing, cleaning, and ensuring that communal items are cleaned in between each user
 - Should CBJ Risk reach High Level:
 - Camps will shut down until further notice

This list may be updated as information about COVID-19 becomes available and depending on the City and Borough of Juneau's COVID-19 Alert Level.

Daily Health Screening (Modified from JDS's Student Participant Daily Health Screen and Adult Daily Entrance Health Screen Protocol)

CAMPER Daily Health Screening

To attend camp, students must be symptom-free and parents/guardians must ensure a "no" to each question below:

Symptoms

- Has your camper had any fever (over 100.4F) within the last 48 hours?
 - Has any medication been used to reduce a fever in the last 24 hours?
- Does your camper have a new cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline)?
- Does your camper have a sore throat currently?
- Does your camper have diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain?
- Has your camper had difficulty breathing in the last 7 days?
- Has your camper lost their sense of taste or smell?
- Does your camper have congestion and/or a runny nose?
- Does your camper have a headache or muscle/body aches?

Close Contact/Potential Exposure

- Has your camper had close contact with anyone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 10 days?
 - Parents/Guardians: If you answer "yes" to any of the questions above, we ask that your camper be kept home and you let the Camp Director know your student will not be attending camp.
- Is there anyone in your household that has COVID-19 symptoms and is awaiting test results, OR has symptoms and has elected not to be tested?
 - Parents/Guardians: If you answer "yes" to this question, notify the Camp Director for further information before sending your student to camp. This does not mean your camper will be excluded automatically.

STAFF Daily Health Screening

To be cleared for entry into camp premises, staff must be symptom free and ensure a "no" to questions below each day.

Symptoms

- Have you had any fever (over 100.4F) within the last 48 hours?
- Has any medication been used to reduce a fever in the last 24 hours?
- Do you have a cough that causes trouble breathing currently (for people with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline)?
- Do you currently have a sore throat?
- Do you have diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain?
- Do you have congestion and/or a runny nose?
- Have you had difficulty breathing in the last 7 days?
- Have you lost your sense of taste or smell?
- Do you have a headache or muscle/body aches?

Close Contact/Potential Exposure

- Have you had close contact with anyone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 10 days or is there someone in your household who has COVID-19 symptoms and is awaiting test results OR has symptoms and has elected not to be tested?
- Has anyone from JEDC requested you get tested in the past 10 days?

If you answer "yes" to any of the questions in this health screen, we ask that you contact your supervisor and do not enter a camp facility.
